In Celebration

Acknowledgement and Affirmation

2. We would like to acknowledge and affirm our 2023 Term 4 awardees for Value Award (Gratitude), Queenstowner Award (Caring Citizen), our budding artists, and sports enthusiasts. They were exemplary in their work and attitude and have done well in striving for excellence! Upcoming Events

Chinese New Year School Celebrations (9 February), Public Holiday (12 February) and School Holiday (13 February)

3. QtPS will be celebrating the Chinese New Year on Friday, 9 February. This year, we celebrate the Year of the Dragon! Students are encouraged to come dressed in their traditional attire/red tops and their school shorts/skorts, school socks, and school shoes. Students will be dismissed at **10.30 am** on 9 February. Bus services will be provided for students taking the school bus on that day.

4. Students are strongly encouraged to bring some snacks, to allow them to enjoy a festive snack break with their peers in class.

5. Please note that Monday, 12 February is a public holiday and Tuesday, 13 February is a school holiday and a designated day off-in-lieu. As such, school will resume on Wednesday, 14 February. Please note that schools will be closed for the two days. This includes the General Office and the Student Care Centre.

6. We wish all our Chinese Queenstowners and their families a Happy and Prosperous Chinese New Year! To the rest of our Queenstown Family, Happy Holidays!

Total Defence Day (15 February)

7. The school will commemorate Total Defence Day on Thursday, 15 February 2024. This year marks 40 years of Total Defence (TD40) in Singapore. As part of our commemoration of TD40 this year, our students will experience a food disruption simulation in school on 15 February 2024.

8. This TD40 Exercise aims to prepare students for potential disruptions to our food supply chain due to climate change, protectionism, or geopolitical tensions etc., given Singapore's reliance on food imports.

9. Please note that the canteen will not serve any form of meat (e.g. chicken, fish and other seafood) on that day to encourage students to be flexible in their food choices and to be open to protein alternatives in the event of such disruptions. Following the exercise, students will reflect

on their experiences and share their thoughts and feelings with their classmates through a guided discussion on 16 February 2024.

10. Parents/Guardians, you may wish to engage your child/ward in sharing his/her experience with you and to reinforce the important message that everyone has a part to play in Singapore's Total Defence effort. We also seek your support in ensuring that you do not pack any form of meat as part of your child's snack or recess meal for that day. This is to provide your child/ward with an authentic learning experience through the food disruption simulation.

P5 Camp (19 February- 21 February)

11. In line with the school vision of developing our students to become "Flourishing Individuals, Future Ready Citizens", the school will be organising the cohort camp for all P5 students from Monday, 19 February to Wednesday, 21 February at Changi Coast Outdoor Adventure Learning Centre.

12. The theme of the camp is "S.O.A.R.ing Beyond Limits". Camp is a place where students not only learn how to be active participants by asking questions, seeking help and trying new things, but it is also an avenue for students to learn to be more independent and to stretch their social, emotional, physical, and cognitive abilities in a setting outside their comfort zone.

13. Through the camp, students will be able to:

- Develop their self-awareness and manage their emotions, actions and well-being
- Respond to challenging tasks positively
- Build close relationships with group members and collaborate with each other to achieve common goals.
