Dear Parents / Guardians,

1. Greetings from Queenstown Primary School! How quickly time flies and we are fast approaching the end of Term 1.

Upcoming Events...

Experiential Learning Week (4 to 8 March)

- 2. Hands-on learning experiences are wonderful ways for our students to grow their knowledge, develop social-emotional competencies and 21st century skills. In line with our endeavour of developing our students to be Critical Thinkers and Caring Citizens, this year's *Experiential Learning Week* will expose our students to a wide range of activities. The activities are:
- Introduction to Computational Thinking (CT) programme to develop our students' ability to break down a complex problem into simpler steps, identify patterns that are relevant to solving the problem, and finally to design the logical steps and rules in order to achieve the desired outcome.
- Values in Action (VIA) are learning experiences that support students' development as socially responsible citizens who contribute meaningfully to the community, through the learning and application of values, knowledge, and skills. VIA fosters student ownership over how they contribute to the community.
- Social Skills Through Art as a learning platform for students to make meaning and apply their social skills through various art-related activities.
- Math Trail to enable our students to see how Mathematics can be applied to our daily lives and develop their problem-solving skills.
- The Junior Achievement (JA) programme allows students to better appreciate real-world concepts and skills, and to understand the relevance of basic skills such as financial literacy.
- Environmental Project-Based Learning @ QtPS allows our students to explore and address environmental problems while building on skills like teamwork, communication, critical thinking and reflection.

<u>Arif Budiman Malay Language Teacher Award 2024</u>

- 9. Nominations for the *Arif Budiman Malay Language Teacher Award* are now open! Jointly organised by the Malay Language Council of Singapore, Malay Language Teachers Association, Berita Harian and the Malay Language Learning and Promotion Committee, this award recognises Malay Language teachers who:
- Instil knowledge, skills and interest in the learning of the Malay language, literature and culture, as well as their care and concern for the well-being of their students; and
- Demonstrate the values of Arif Budiman, a learned person who contributes to society through excellent and exemplary service as an educator.

Advisory on Vaping and E-vaporisers

- 12. E-vaporisers are illegal in Singapore. Under the Tobacco (Control of Advertisements and Sale) Act, the possession, use or purchase of e-vaporisers carries a maximum fine of \$2,000. It is also an offence to import, distribute, sell or offer for sale e-vaporisers and their components. Any person convicted of such offences is liable to a fine of up to \$10,000, or imprisonment of up to six months or both for the first offence, and a fine of up to \$20,000, or imprisonment of up to 12 months or both for the second or subsequent offence. All prohibited tobacco items will be seized and confiscated.
- 13. MOE takes a firm stand against vaping. Vaping is categorised as a serious offence. When students are caught using or in possession of e-vaporisers, the prohibited product will be confiscated and their parents will be informed. The schools will report the offender to HSA and also manage vaping-related offences through existing disciplinary frameworks. These include taking school-based disciplinary actions, such as suspension or caning (for boys). Students caught vaping will also be placed on cessation support programmes where counsellors will guide them through their cessation journey to effect long-term behavioural change.
- 14. Parents have an important part to play in their children's education. There are resources and relevant information that parents can access on Parent Hub. Parents are encouraged to have a serious conversation with their children about vaping to prevent it from becoming a life-long habit.
