#### Athletics Fiesta for P3 to P6 students (7 August)

- 4. Our Athletics Fiesta will take place on Monday, 7 August, in the morning at the stadium located at the Academy of Singapore Teachers (AST) at Malan Road. This event aims to provide our P3 to P6 students with an opportunity to showcase their athletic abilities by applying what they have learnt in Athletics during their Physical Education lessons, while promoting mass participation in physical activities. All P3 to P6 students will report to school at the usual reporting time at 7.30 am and will be dismissed from school at 12.30 pm. A separate letter will be issued through your child/ward to provide you with more information.

#### National Day Celebration (8 August) & Holidays (9 and 10 August)

- 6. QtPS will be celebrating Singapore's 58th birthday on Tuesday, 8 August 2023! Our exciting celebrations will include a mini concert as well as classroom activities, all focusing on the theme for National Day 2023, 'Onward As One'. As there will be no recess break for the students, the school will be providing each student with a packet of Gem Biscuits. Students are encouraged to come dressed in red T-shirts, their school shorts/skorts, school socks and school shoes. As part of the celebration, students will be dismissed at 10.00 am on Tuesday, 8 August 2023.
- 7. The celebrations will be followed by a public holiday and a school holiday. Students should return to school on Friday, 11 August.

# Concluding Remarks...

16. In the last Open Letter, I wrote about the school value for the term, Resilience, and how we should instil in our students the ability to bounce back quickly from setbacks and struggles while holding on to their core values and beliefs. This month, I would like to share another

aspect of Resilience, which is how we view and tackle the challenges that come our way. I would like to share this story about resilience with you.

One day a farmer's donkey fell down into a well. The animal cried piteously for hours as the farmer tried to figure out what to do. Finally, he decided the animal was old, and the well needed to be covered up anyway, so it just wasn't worth it to retrieve the donkey.

He invited all of his neighbours to come over and help him. They all grabbed a shovel and began to shovel dirt into the well. At first, the donkey realised what was happening and cried horribly. Then, to everyone's amazement, it quieted down.

A few shovel loads later, the farmer finally looked down the well. He was astonished at what he saw. With each shovel of dirt that hit its back, the donkey was doing something amazing. It would shake it off and take a step up.

As the farmer's neighbours continued to shovel dirt on top of the animal, it would shake it off and take a step up. Pretty soon, everyone was amazed as the donkey stepped up over the edge of the well and happily trotted off!

When seeing challenges as stepping stones becomes a habit, our Queenstowners will have the resilience they need for success.
